



Background

- The Reconnecting Albina Planning Project (RAPP) is a partnership between Albina Vision Trust (AVT), the Portland Bureau of Planning and Sustainability (BPS), Portland Bureau of Transportation (PBOT), and Prosper Portland to:
- Create a district-wide development framework plan for Lower Albina that fosters equitable and sustainable outcomes, centered on restorative development for Portland's historic Albina and Black communities.
- Previous and ongoing planning efforts in the area will serve as a foundation on which to refine and build land use, urban design, and transportation policies and tools.




Framework Concepts

- Three major sub areas
- Focus on land use, transportation, urban design and public space, and future development potential
- Examining how subareas relate to each other and function within the broader district
- Improving the pedestrian/bike experience through and between the subareas and important destinations



East

- Broadway/Weidler, increased capacity for housing and businesses and opportunity for public space
- Green loop connection on Broadway/Weidler and other pedestrian improvements
- North area "Cornerstones" buildings, culturally significant buildings and mix of land uses
- South of Weidler Mix of uses, potential for connectivity and open space



West


- North and South knitted together with residential uses and neighborhood amenities
- Prophet site (PPS site): residential neighborhood
- Opportunities for infill development and improved connectivity in and around Moda Center
- Opportunities for Waterfront Access
- Gateway Opportunities



Central (Highway Cover)

- Supporting existing vision established in Summer 2024 workshops
- Continuing to explore issues of urban design and public space
- Neighborhood identity as key, gateways, monuments
- Designing for a hierarchy of public space
